

Camp Information

Below is all of the information you'll need to be prepared for camp!

Hi guys! We know that this year's choir camp will not look like it has in the past, but the officers have spent a lot of time working together to plan a "virtual camp" that will be as meaningful and as fun as possible. Below is an explanation of everything you'll need to know for camp, including explanations of the activities, music assignments, and any other information you'll need to know. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to reach out to any of the directors or officers via email or through the choir instagram account (@hdvseniorchoir). We hope that you guys enjoy everything that we have planned for camp this year!

Daily Videos: Each day, you will need to watch a short video that explains everything that you'll need to know in order to participate in the daily activities. All of the video links will be compiled in a google doc and the doc will be posted on hdvchoirs.com under the Virtual Choir Camp page.

Daily activities: Each day, there will be 1-2 activities. These activities have been planned to help everyone get to know each other and to help include some of the fun traditions that we won't be able to do in person this year. There will be a video for each activity that will explain everything that you'll need to know.

Theme Nights: Theme nights are a very fun tradition that are always a part of camp. Each night you'll have an opportunity to dress up to match the given theme in hopes of winning a prize. Each night we will have 3 winners. All submissions must be submitted between 7 PM and 9 PM each night by either DMing your picture to the choir instagram account (@hdvseniorchoir) or by posting your picture on instagram with the hashtag #hdvchoircamp2020 in order to be eligible to win. This also

allows the officers to decide and announce the winners each night. This year's themes include:

- Character Night: Dress as your favorite movie, TV show, or video game character.
- Safari Night: Dress as if you were to go on a safari.
- Age Night: Sophomores and Juniors will dress as babies and Seniors will dress as senior citizens,
- Meme Night: Dress up as your favorite meme.
- 80s Night: Dress as if you were living in the 80s. The more leg warmers and neon the better!

We know that dressing up at home won't be the same as dressing up at camp, but we hope that you take part in this activity as it is always a fun part of camp each year! An easy way to plan for each theme night is to go to a thrift store and see what you can find!

Introduction presentations: This Zoom call will have a google slides presentation and a kahoot to help everyone get to know each other. This will take place on the first day of camp.

Teams: Everyone will be assigned a team for the weekly activities. The team assignments will be posted on hdvchoirs.com. You will work with your team virtually to complete the scavenger hunt as well as any other activity throughout the week where teams are needed. While we are broken into teams, this does not mean that you are permitted to meet up in person to complete these tasks. We hope that you will become closer with your teammates throughout the week even though you may not be able to meet in person!

Scavenger Hunt: We have created a scavenger hunt with various things that can be found around Hilliard. The scavenger hunt will be completed through an app called "Goosechase", and all picture/video submissions and scoring will be completed through the app. The app is very simple

to use, and we will put out a video explaining more about the scavenger hunt the day of the hunt itself. As previously mentioned, you will be divided into teams for this scavenger hunt for scoring purposes and to get to know each other better. You are not permitted to meet up with your team to complete this scavenger hunt. Your team's score will not be impacted based on how many people are in each picture, we are mainly looking for creativity in all of the submissions. Our goal is for everyone to be safe and have fun! Please be smart and follow safety guidelines whenever possible.

Newbie Surprise: This is an opportunity for the newbies to work together remotely to make a presentation for the rest of the choir. More details will be given out on the day of the Newbie Surprise.

Section Songs: This will be an opportunity for each section to create a song to share to the rest of the choir. More details will be shared the day of the section song activity.

*Both the Newbie Surprise and Section Songs will be held over Zoom. The groups will have around 40 minutes to come up with their idea over zoom. They will then have the option to type out their song, create some sort of shared presentation, or compile separate videos to create one final video of their song to share to everyone. There aren't many restrictions with the format of the Newbie Surprise or the Section Songs, but you must follow social distancing guidelines and complete it in the given amount of time. Both of these typically end up with the groups writing some sort of parody, but original songs are also an option. More details will be given within these Zooms themselves.

TLBYAKY Sectionals: This activity will be through a Zoom call. The section leaders will teach The Lord Bless You and Keep You to their sections. Sheet music will be available to download at hdvchoirs.com under the Virtual Choir Camp page.

Game Night: This will be a chance to virtually play some games through Houseparty and Jackbox Games with other choir members. You do not have to participate the entire time, but definitely take advantage of this time to have some fun and get to know other members of the choir. Links will be posted on the link page, which can be found at hdvchoirs.com.

Lady of the Lake Story: This year, the Lady of the Lake Story is recorded on video, and everyone will have a chance to watch the video on their own. This is a fun tradition at camp, and we hope you still enjoy it even though we may not be able to hear it in person.
